The Guest Speaker at Sunrise was Nick Flack, Chief Executive Officer, Hawke's Bay Airport. He commenced this role in February, having previously been GM Assets & Safety at Christchurch Airport and earlier held management positions at Lyttleton Port and

Centre Port. Amond other things, he covered the Hawke's Bay Airport using the latest high performance lighting technology to upgrade its runway lighting system. The new system has some interesting features including pilot activated lighting, which allows for approaching or departing aircraft to activate the runway lighting when flying after hours.


